- 1. Update on Sept 29th meeting with Shawn Nason Michelle / Eric
  - a. Shawn Nason's proposal for \$100 000 for our park was denied by the City for additional funding
  - b. Shawn Nason agreed to fund 50% of the cost of planting and curbing that will take place in Spring 2021 for the Front Signage
  - c. Shawn Nason proposed we consider installation of a fountain in the pond (to be maintained and funded by the Association)
- 2. Events
  - a. Halloween SPRA will not organize any activities or guide residents as to how to celebrate, due to the pandemic
  - b. Holiday Festivities discussion postponed to next meeting
- 3. Welcome to the neighborhood package
  - a. Don proposed welcoming new residents by putting together a package that includes a copy of the neighbourhood newsletter, information on garbage/recycling day pick-up, information on the association website, Facebook site and NextDoor app
- 4. Front Signage
  - a. There was a fantastic volunteer turn out for the planting. Residents have since voiced positive reviews
  - b. Don will wrap cedars for the winter
  - c. Curbing deferred until in the spring
- 5. Incorporating / Bylaws Update
  - a. Incorporation is partially completed
  - b. We are looking for a new lawyer
  - c. Don will contact other residents' associations for advice for moving forward

- 6. Newsletter Update
  - a. Final touches to the layout need to be completed and then the newsletters will be delivered
- 7. Annual Association Fee
  - a. Poster for the fees were approved
- 8. Half Basketball / Pickleball Court Update
  - a. Building Sustainable Communities grant is due Jan 15, 2021. We are looking for support from Audrey Gordon for this grant.
  - b. Red River Co-Op grant will have a second intake in early 2021.
- 9. Neighborhood Watch
  - a. Darlene will help advise our community on how to run the Neighbourhood Watch, and how to stay safe
  - b. We will consider contacting the community relations officer to get additional ideas
- 10. New Business
  - a. It is important for all residents to do their part to keep sidewalks ice free. Many residents use the main loop for leisure.
